Suspect in shooting is released

Case is too weak for \$1M bond

STAMFORD — Police yesterday released the suspect in Thursday night's West Side shooting, saying the case was not strong enough to hold him on \$1 million bond.

Police defended their arrest early Friday of Tyrone Robertson, 25, of 2 Fairview Ave., Norwalk, and did not withdraw attempted murder charges after his release.

Robertson was with his girlfriend the night of the shooting, his attorney, Lindy Urso, has said.

Robertson arrived voluntarily at police headquarters Friday morning after reports of his alleged involvement in the shooting surfaced in the media.

■ Authorities said they arrested Tyrone Robertson, 25, of Norwalk, based on statements from witnesses, including the 19-year-old victim who identified Robertson as the gunman.

in releasing Robertson after he signed a promise to appear Dec. 13 in state Superior Court in Stamford, Urso said yesterday.

Urso said he expected the charges to be dropped eventually.

"I guess his alibi checked out," Urso said.
